Last Inning for Super Saturday Games Divisions 2 & 3

Umpire to look at clock after home team bats in each inning. If it less than 1 hour since the first pitch of the game, another inning is played. If it has been 1 hour since the first pitch of the game or longer, the game is over.

Last Inning for Super Saturday Games Divisions 4, 5, & 6

Whatever inning game is in precisely 1 hour after the first pitch of the game will be the last inning. If visiting team is batting at that time, an unlimited number of runs can be scored by either team until 3 outs are made. If the home team is batting, team is limited to seven runs.

Super Saturday Run & Dugout Rules

For all divisions, except division 6, runs will be given at the start of the game based on the following:

- 1. Count the number of regular season wins for each team.
- 2. Subtract the lower number of wins from the higher number.
- 3. Divide the result from step two by 2.
- 4. The resulting answer is how many runs the team with fewer wins will start with. Round down in cases where a half of run is involved.
- 5. The team with fewer wins will be the home team and use the third base dugout. If same number of wins, coin flip to decide home team.

Example:

- Cubs have 10 wins; Bears have 3 wins
- 10 3 = 7; $7 \div 2 = 3.5$;
- Game starts with Bears ahead 3 − 0.
- Bears use the 3rd base dugout, are the home team, and bat last.
